WHEREAS, the Borough of Sayreville and Jersey Central Power & Light Company ("JCP&L") entered into an Agreement wherein the Borough paid JCP&L for its operation and maintenance of street lights throughout the Borough; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Agreement, JCP&L is to furnish all required fixtures, lamps, poles, brackets, wires, insulators, and other equipment and apparatus, including all labor necessary for the installation and maintenance of the street lighting, as well as supplying the electricity necessary to light the lamps; and

WHEREAS, there currently exists numerous street lights throughout the Borough which are not functioning properly, and periodically there have been various street lights throughout the Borough that were not functioning properly; and

WHEREAS, despite being notified by the Borough of such non-functioning street lights, there are times were JCP&L has failed to make the requisite repairs to same;

WHEREAS, the Agreement between the Borough and JCP&L provides that the Borough may make a pro rata deduction for each dusk to dawn period for each light not functioning from the monthly payment due to JCP&L, provided that no deduction shall be made for any light having been repaired by JCP&L within seventy-two (72) hours of receiving notice of the outage; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council find it to be in the best interest of the Borough to authorize the Borough's withholding of such pro rata monthly payments to JCP&L for all street lights not functioning from dusk to dawn during such time period.


