A RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF SAYREVILLE AUTHORIZING A SUBRECIPIENT AGREEMENT WITH THE NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AFFAIRS FOR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT-DISASTER RECOVERY FUNDS TO RECONSTRUCT AND UPGRADE THE MELROSE PUMP STATION

WHEREAS, on September 5, 2021, the President of the United States declared Hurricane Ida a disaster, including all of New Jersey's twenty-one counties in the disaster declaration under DR-4614; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Disaster Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2022, Pub. L. 117-43, and the Continuing Appropriations Act of 2023, Pub. L. 117-180, the United States Congress appropriated funds to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") to be allocated as Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery ("CDBG-DR") among States; and

WHEREAS, HUD allocated a total of \$377,575,000 to the State of New Jersey in CDBG-DR funds to help households and communities recover from Hurricane Ida; and

WHEREAS, the State submitted to HUD, and HUD approved on November 21, 2022, the Hurricane Ida CDBG-DR Action Plan, which included the Resilient Communities Program designed to address unmet recovery and mitigation needs for public infrastructure in HUD identified and State-identified Most Impacted and Distressed ("MID") areas; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs ("DCA") has been designated by HUD to administer the State's CDBG-DR funds, which are subject to Federal statutes and regulations governing the use of CDBG-DR funds, as modified by any exceptions and waivers previously granted and which may hereinafter be granted by HUD; and

WHEREAS, DCA has designated the Borough of Sayreville ("the Borough") as a Subrecipient for CDBG-DR funds to implement the Resilient Communities Program Project in the amount of Two million, eight hundred fifty-nine thousand, seven hundred eighty dollars (\$2,859,780.00); and

WHEREAS, the public purpose to be derived from this Agreement is to provide funding for infrastructure projects that will help impacted communities become more resilient to current and future natural hazards as they recover from Hurricane Ida and work to mitigate future risks; and

WHEREAS, the Borough will use CDBG-DR funds to reconstruct and upgrade the Melrose Pump Station to enhance its resilience against flooding and coastal storm events; and

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to sign a Subrecipient Agreement with DCA (attached hereto as Exhibit A) to fund this project;

**RESOLUTION SUPPORTING NEW JERSEY ASSEMBLY
RESOLUTION AR-149 SUPPORTING ALL LAW
ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS THROUGHOUT THE STATE**

WHEREAS, there is pending Resolution before the New Jersey Assembly (Resolution AR-149), expressing the Assembly's support for all law enforcement officers throughout the State, and urging municipalities to adopt similar Resolutions expressing their support for law enforcement; and

WHEREAS, law enforcement officers serve the public honorably, working tirelessly and relentlessly to safeguard the communities they are sworn to protect and functioning as the backbone of public safety in this State and across the nation; and

WHEREAS, law enforcement officers routinely and selflessly risk their own lives and safety to combat crime; remove dangerous and lethal drugs from the streets; and protect all people regardless of religion, race, gender, sexual orientation, age, ability, or socio-economic status; and

WHEREAS, in addition to their day-to-day police work, law enforcement officers have the ever-increasing responsibility of responding to threats of violence, which have expanded from targeting elected officials and political figures to also targeting Chief Executive Officers (CEOs), health care providers, housing administrators, educators, and judges; and

WHEREAS, while upholding the rule of law and maintaining the safety, stability, and public order on, which communities depend, law enforcement officers also strengthen communities by providing a quiet and steady presence and taking on responsibilities that extend far beyond traditional law enforcement duties; and

WHEREAS, law enforcement officers commit countless acts of service that often go unrecognized, such as checking in on elderly residents, mentoring youth, responding to crises, including mental health crises, and conducting community outreach; and

WHEREAS, nonetheless, many political and community leaders support defunding or dismantling police departments across the nation, which would undermine public safety and place both officers and the communities they serve at greater risk; and

WHEREAS, there has been a disturbing rise in hate-fueled rhetoric from political and community leaders, which has contributed to the increasing number of violent acts against law enforcement officers, elected officials, and members of the public; and

WHEREAS, sanctuary city policies that restrict cooperation with U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) actively encourage resentment of local law enforcement and often pit local, state, and federal law enforcement against one another; and

WHEREAS, politicians across the nation have demonized ICE law enforcement officers, stating their cities were at war with ICE, calling for ICE officers to leave their state or city, and comparing ICE to the Nazi Party and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republic's KGB; and

WHEREAS, individuals on social media, talk radio, and other media platforms not only publicize this anti-law enforcement rhetoric but often add their own hate-fueled rhetoric that demonizes law enforcement officers; and

WHEREAS, this increasingly inflammatory rhetoric and the resulting violence against law enforcement officers frequently reflects partisan ideology that ignores the critical role law enforcement officers play in their communities; and

WHEREAS, law enforcement officers deserve the deepest respect, unwavering support, and profound gratitude from all New Jersey citizens and governmental entities in the State; and

WHEREAS, while open public discourse is proper and protected under the First Amendment to the United States Constitution; it is in the public interest of the citizens of the State and this great nation to condemn, in the strongest terms, the increasingly inflammatory rhetoric and actions that incite, encourage, or legitimize violence against law enforcement officers; and

WHEREAS, for the above reasons, the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Sayreville supports New Jersey Assembly Resolution AR-149, and seeks to express the Borough's support for all law enforcement officers throughout the State.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Sayreville, in the County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey, that the Borough supports New Jersey Assembly Resolution AR-149, and hereby expresses the Borough's support for all law enforcement officers for their critical and noble work performed throughout the State and across the Nation.
