

A Day in the Life of a Masjid: A Quarterly Breakdown

Masjids serve as centers of worship, education, and community engagement throughout the year. Each quarter brings different religious activities, cultural events, and learning opportunities. Below is a breakdown of a typical day in a Masjid during each quarter, considering the five daily prayers, evening classes, and seasonal activities.

Quarter 1 (January – March) – Day Feb 15

Fajr (Dawn Prayer) – Early Morning - **Prayer Time 6:15 AM to 6:30 AM** (Prayers lasts approximately ~ 15 mins)

- The masjid opens before dawn.
- Worshippers gather for Fajr prayer, often staying for Quran recitation and supplications.

Morning – After Sunrise

- Quiet time for personal worship and Masjid maintenance.
- Open hours for individual prayer and study.

Dhuhr (Midday Prayer) - Noon - Prayer Time 1:30 PM to 1:45 PM

- Congregants attend the Dhuhr prayer.
- Short Islamic reminders or khutbahs may follow.

Asr (Afternoon Prayer) – Mid-Afternoon - Prayer Time 4:15 PM to 4:30 PM

- Asr prayer takes place in the congregation.
- Islamic school sessions for children in the afternoon.
- Community members may gather for study circles.

Maghrib (Sunset Prayer) – Evening - Prayer Time 5:40 PM to 5:55 PM

- Maghrib prayer is performed right after sunset.
- Evening Islamic classes for youth and adults.
- Iftar meals are provided for the community during Ramadan. (Only during the month of Ramadan)

Isha (Night Prayer) & Events – Late Evening - Prayer Time 8:00 PM to 8:15 PM

- Study circles or special lectures follow Isha's prayer.
- Weekly Halaqas (study circles) or guest speaker events.
- Special **Taraweeh prayers** are performed during Ramadan. (Which extends 2 hours after Isha Prayers)* (Only during the month of Ramadan)
- The masjid closes after the last worshippers complete their prayers.



Quarter 2 (April – June) – Day May 15

Fajr (Dawn Prayer) – Early Morning - Prayer Time 5:00 AM to 5:15 AM (Prayers lasts approximately \sim 15 mins)

- The masjid opens before dawn.
- Worshippers gather for Fajr prayer, often staying for Quran recitation and supplications.

Morning - After Sunrise

- Quiet time for personal worship and Masjid maintenance.
- Open hours for individual prayer and study.

Dhuhr (Midday Prayer) - Noon - Prayer Time 1:30 PM to 1:45 PM

- Congregants attend the Dhuhr prayer.
- Short Islamic reminders or khutbahs may follow.

Asr (Afternoon Prayer) – Mid-Afternoon - Prayer Time 6:15 PM to 6:30 PM

- Asr prayer takes place in the congregation.
- Islamic school sessions for children in the afternoon.
- Community members may gather for study circles.

Maghrib (Sunset Prayer) - Evening - Prayer Time 8:17 PM to 8:32 PM

- Maghrib prayer is performed right after sunset.
- Evening Islamic classes for youth and adults.

Isha (Night Prayer) & Events - Late Evening - Prayer Time 10:00 PM to 10:15 PM

- Study circles or special lectures follow Isha's prayer.
- Weekly Halaqas (study circles) or guest speaker events.
- The masjid closes after the last worshippers complete their prayers.



Quarter 3 (July – September) – Day August 15

Fajr (Dawn Prayer) – Early Morning - Prayer Time 5:30 AM to 5:45 AM (Prayers lasts approximately \sim 15 mins)

- The masjid opens before dawn.
- Worshippers gather for Fajr prayer, often staying for Quran recitation and supplications.

Morning – After Sunrise

- Quiet time for personal worship and Masjid maintenance.
- Open hours for individual prayer and study.

Dhuhr (Midday Prayer) - Noon - Prayer Time 1:30 PM to 1:45 PM

- Congregants attend the Dhuhr prayer.
- Short Islamic reminders or khutbahs may follow.

Asr (Afternoon Prayer) - Mid-Afternoon - Prayer Time 6:15 PM to 6:30 PM

- Asr prayer takes place in the congregation.
- Islamic school sessions for children in the afternoon.

Maghrib (Sunset Prayer) – Evening - Prayer Time 8:05 PM to 8:20 PM

- Maghrib prayer is performed right after sunset.
- Evening Islamic classes for youth and adults.

Isha (Night Prayer) & Events - Late Evening - Prayer Time 9:30 PM to 9:45 PM

- Study circles or special lectures follow Isha's prayer.
- Weekly Halaqas (study circles) or guest speaker events.
- The masjid closes after the last worshippers complete their prayers.



Quarter 4 (October – December) – Day November 15

Fajr (Dawn Prayer) – Early Morning - Prayer Time 6:00 AM to 6:15 AM (Prayers lasts approximately \sim 15 mins)

- The masjid opens before dawn.
- Worshippers gather for Fajr prayer, often staying for Quran recitation and supplications.

Morning – After Sunrise

- Quiet time for personal worship and Masjid maintenance.
- Open hours for individual prayer and study.

Dhuhr (Midday Prayer) - Noon - Prayer Time 1:30 PM to 1:45 PM

- Maghrib prayer is performed right after sunset.
- Evening Islamic classes for youth and adults.

Isha (Night Prayer) & Events – Late Evening - Prayer Time 8:00 PM to 8:15 PM

- Study circles or special lectures follow Isha's prayer.
- Weekly Halaqas (study circles) or guest speaker events.
- The masjid closes after the last worshippers complete their prayers.
